The Gospel for April

April 2nd, John 20:1-18

The Empty Tomb

20 Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter...and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

Jesus Has Risen

28 After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. ² for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven... ⁵ The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you."

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles ^[a] from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷ He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?"

The Good Shepherd and His Sheep

² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁷ Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁹ I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. ^[a] They will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.



Luke 24: 19—34 On the Road to Emmaus

¹⁹ "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. ²² In addition, some of our

women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive.

²⁴ Then some of our companions

²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus." ²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. 29 But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. 30 When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. 33 They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together 34 and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon."

BEHOLD THE MAN!

And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up, took hold of his feet and worshiped him.—Matt. 28:9

If God has a body,

then bodies

must matter.

God has feet. It's a profound mystery that stands at the heart and the center of all of Scripture. Jesus is God in human flesh who walked with real human feet on a journey to the cross. Jesus stood on His feet in front of Pontius Pilate who derisively pointed to Him and said, "Behold the man." Those feet of His would soon be pierced with the nails that held Him to the cross. Then His lifeless feet would be laid to rest in a tomb. Yet He wasn't done standing on those feet of His. On the third day, He stood outside that tomb to greet the women who had come to anoint His body in a final burial rite. But instead of

putting spices on a pair of cold, lifeless feet they would fall down in worship, grabbing hold of those feet that were once again warm and very much alive.

Pilate said, "Behold the man."
Well, we have. We behold Him as
the Words of Holy Scripture reveal
Him to us. And because of this we
know that we celebrate and proclaim the God-man who was dead

but now is alive, the One who died our death and rose again so that we too may rise again from our own graves.

That's the central truth of the Christian faith and it's to be at the heart and center of all that we do as a congregation. If He is not raised from the dead with His body, then we have nothing to celebrate. But because His real body rose from the tomb we know that our real bodies with our real feet that have carried us through life with their callouses,

blisters, ingrown toenails, and aching arches, will be those raised incorruptible from our graves on the day of Jesus' return.

Even now, before that day of the resurrection of the dead, we experience the gift of renewal and life in our resurrected Savior. As baptized believers in Christ we are right now united into the body of Christ. His death and resurrection have become our death and resurrection. We most clearly confess and celebrate this unity when we kneel together to receive the once crucified and now resurrected body of Christ in the


Sacrament of the Altar. And we can have no more intimate unity with our Savior than to receive into our mouths His own body and blood—given on the cross to redeem us, body and soul.

Because God became man for you in the person of Jesus, the second person of the Holy Trinity, you know that all of you matters to God. God is not just concerned with your soul. If God has a body, then bodies must

matter. He cares for you in body and soul, even as He has redeemed you, body and soul and will raise you from your grave, body and soul.

May the truth of God in human flesh be the cause of your Easter celebration and the source of your joy as you walk on those feet that are yours both in this life now and in the life of the world to come. Amen.



Healing the Invisible Wounds of War through Horses

Spirit Warrior, Central Maine — \$95,000

Maine is among the list of "least churched" states in the nation. It has only three LCMS churches in the entire state and has only five Veteran Administration Chaplains. Deaconess Kim Slininger was called to Hope Lutheran Church to reach out to the extensive veteran and military community in the Bangor area. Deaconess Kim is herself a disabled veteran, and the Spirit Warrior program is an extension of her ministry. Spirit Warrior is a program that addresses the need to provide pastoral/diaconal care using horses, to those who have stood in the face of evil and have returned. Current traditional therapy does not address the care of the spirit. Many veterans/service members want to connect with God and theological discussions take place while caring for the horses. This grant will provide funding for 58 veterans to go through the program.


