⁹ Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and

that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. 11 Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves. 12 Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. 13 And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.

Jesus: "Whoever confesses Me before men, I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven."

The life of the Christian is one of confession. It is a life that gives witness to the character and nature of God. It is a life of integrity in which one's actions and words match what one confesses to believe about God.

It is the character and nature of God to be merciful and to save sinners through the forgiveness of sins. Christ Jesus took up human flesh so that He might live a life of perfect integrity and true confession of God. In word and in deed He gave witness to God's merciful, saving nature, even to the point of giving His innocent life on the cross to save sinners.

The life of the Christian begins with the confession of one's own sinfulness and need of salvation. It is a life of turning away from sin and toward your Savior who forgives that sin for the sake of His innocent suffering and death. The Christian is then moved by the work of the Holy Spirit to live out this confession by being merciful and loving toward others, and by continually receiving from God more of His merciful

forgiveness.

This faith, this life, and this confession are packaged up by God and delivered in one integrated whole through the waters of Holy Baptism. On Sunday, May 7, three of our young members will give confession to what they received on the day of their Baptism. They will give this confession before God and before the congregation in the Rite of Confirmation.

Join with us that day to give thanks to God for His good work in the lives of these three Christians and to be reminded of the life and the confession that were delivered to you also in the life-giving waters of Baptism. Follow along with the Rite of Confirmation and prayerfully consider how your life

does or does not align with what you confess to be the character and nature of God. And where you are led to see your failure to live a life of perfect integrity and true confession of God, hear His word of promise to you: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

Then rejoice that we are blessed to be a part of God's work, passing this confession and faith on to the next generation!

WE HAVE HAD A COUPLE TEACHERS THAT LEFT FOR NEW ADVENTURES IN LIFE AND DECIDED THEY LIKED OUR ADVENTURES BETTER AND HAVE RETURNED TO US. A THOUSAND THANK YOUS TO THEM.

ON APRIL 23RD, THE DAYCARE HAD THEIR 2023 PRESCHOOL GRADUATION. WE HAD FOUR LITTLE BOYS THAT WILL BE GOING TO KINDERGARTEN THIS FALL. WE TAKE OUR GRADUATION VERY SERIOUS HERE AT THE CENTER. WE ARE SO BLESSED TO BE ABLE TO HAVE OUR GRADUATION ON A SUNDAY DURING OUR CHURCH SERVICE WITH THE CONGREGATION. ALONG WITH THE CHILDREN SINGING FOR THE CONGREGATION, EACH CHILD RECEIVES A DIPLOMA STATING THEY HAVE GRADUATED. THE CHURCH GIVES EACH CHILD THEIR VERY OWN FIRST BIBLE, AND THE WOMEN QUILTING GROUP FROM THE CHURCH GIVES EACH CHILD A QUILT. SUCH MEMORIES FOR THE CHILDREN TO HAVE FOR YEARS.

THE CENTER IS WORKING ON OUR SUMMER SCHOOL AGE PROGRAM. WE WILL NEED 15 CHILDREN TO HAVE THE SUMMER PROGRAM. Orphan Grain Train

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) is a recognized service organization (RSO) of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS). In 1992, Rev. Ray S. Wilke, pastor of Grace Lutheran Church in Norfolk, Neb., volunteered with a group of Lutherans who traveled to Latvia and Russia to help with a church mission. There they met people with "no hope" in desperate need of spiritual, emotional, and humanitarian aid after the breakup of the former Soviet Union. This need led to the formation of the Orphan Grain Train.

Today: it is a hands-on mission project with 27 regional locations.

"More than 3,728 semi-trailer truckloads of food, clothing, medical supplies, and religious materials have been sent to 69 countries and several disaster areas in the U.S. since 1992. All of this is done by volunteers and individual contributors – people who are thankful for their blessings and want to provide a blessing to someone they will probably never see this side of heaven." Rev. Ray S. Wilke, President of Orphan Grain Train. – ogt.org/our-story/

Some of the projects during the past thirty years:

- More than 45 million fortified-rice meals and 4,230 shipments of humanitarian aid to needy people in several states and 69 countries on 5 continents
- A mobile chapel was built with help from a grant funded by LCMS Disaster Relief to assist St.
 John's Lutheran Church in Pilger, NE after their church was demolished by a F4 tornado
- Assistance was given to people in Texas after Hurricane Michael in October 2017 left behind death and destruction of businesses and homes
- Since 1992, more than 4 million hours have been volunteered

One of the regional locations is in Clemons, IA. This site operates on Tuesdays, from 8:00 a.m. to noon. For more information about Orphan Grain Train – go to their website – ogt.org

Council Notes for May 2023 Newsletter

The Risen Christ Church Council is elected as representatives of the congregation as the church follows its purpose in preaching the word of God, caring for its members, and serving in God's Kingdom.

Council met on April 13th, 2023 and discussed issues and items as described below.

Pastors Report - Pastor Licht reported on the Joyce Miller funeral. There were transfer requests approved by the **Elder Board**: David Fletcher to Parkview and Cheryl Ehrler's et al. to Our Savior. 3 students are in confirmation class and will be confirmed on May 7th. The Church just finished with Holy Week and Easter consisting of multiple services. New Member class is on-going. Pastor continues to work with the Lutheran Home coordinating worship services with other circuit pastors. Pastor Licht is being listed as a referral for anyone who may request pastoral care at Eagle View Behavioral Health.

Church Administrator – Stephen is working on the Personnel Manual and is going to make both RCLC and LBDC Personnel Manuals consistent. Stephen is also reviewing financial policies. The Council/Congregation and ad hoc committee concerning LBDC mission charter met and Stephen reported on that meeting. Work continues on the LBDC mission charter. Stephen is working on a hail damage assessment and will contact the insurance company. Stephen continues to work with Barb on payroll while Barb is out of the office. Stephen is working with the Elder Board on the membership records for the church.

Treasurer – **Michelle** provided the report for March RCLC finances. There was a \$3288.00 shortfall for March, bringing the first quarter deficit to \$12, 267.00. LBDC finances were positive for March with a 5,799.00 surplus bringing the first quarter surplus number to \$2,488.00. Notable is that overtime for LBDC teachers is being paid from the Stabilization grant. Motion to accept the Treasurers report was made and approved.

Education and Children's Ministry – Heidi reported that the Easter Egg Hunt was successful. The youth participated in the Lenten Suppers and Easter Breakfast. There will be a Burger and Bond Fire for the youth on April 28th. A Steam Wheeler game is being planned for the youth on May 12th. VBS will be June 12th – June 16th, 2023. Discussions are ongoing regarding the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans in 2025

Congregation Life/Fellowship Committee – This committee has been formed to generate fellowship within the congregation. They will meet on the 1st Monday of each month at 4:00 PM at Church. Anyone is welcome to attend these meetings.

- 5 stackable highchairs were purchased through the Memorial Funds.
- There will be a Sunday Pot Luck on April 30th after Bible Study/Sunday School.
- Heidi reported on some kitchen subjects and suggested that the Congregation Life Committee be designated
 as an overseer for the kitchen to ensure that the refrigerator and cabinets on the church side were maintained
 and supplies coordinated. A motion was made and approved to this affect.

Elders – Tim reported that the membership list work is on-going. A new list of individuals listed as members, but not having attended for two years was generated and reviewed. A letter will be out-going to those individuals and regular procedures are being established for this type of review to happen on an annual basis. A training pouring chalice has been obtained to allow Elders to practice with the pouring chalice. Special Music is being coordinated for around the time of Pentecost. Pastor will institute a return of the Passing of the Peace and the meaning behind it on April 16th. Pastor has provided information on what to do in the event that no ordained pastor was available for Sunday worship. The Elder Board will be working with the Stewardship Board on developing time and talent information for the congregation. The Elder Board will be working with the Congregation Life Committee on the assimilation of new members.

Future Planning – Dave reported on Future planning and brought forth two motions from the Future Planning committee.

The first motion was a result of the church receiving a letter of recommendation from Iowa District East to engage with Alliance Defending Freedom in a ministry alliance regarding legal matters

Alliance Defending Freedom Motion

- Whereas, culture has created a liability risk for faith-based religious organizations,
- Whereas the LCMS and Iowa District East has entered a ministry alliance with Alliance Defending Freedom,
- Whereas <u>Alliance Defending Freedom</u> will provide the first line of defense in the event our ministry faces legal threat,
- Whereas, Risen Christ Lutheran Church with Little Blessings Daycare, has an available first line of legal defense through <u>Alliance Defending Freedom</u> at a cost of approximately \$600 annually,
- Therefore, be it resolved that Risen Christ Lutheran Church enter into an alliance with <u>Alliance Defending</u> Freedom as soon as possible with funding source to be approved by council.
 - -This motion was seconded and approved with funding from the Major Savings Fund.
 - -The second motion was the result of LCMS funding the training of staff and volunteers in Ministry Safe; a training for ministry workers who engage with children.

Ministry Safe Motion

- Recommend that a policy be added to all employee handbooks, and the volunteer handbook stating that all
 people who routinely interact with children at RCLC complete the Ministry Safe training
- Funded by: LCMS office of School Ministries. Enrolling sooner is better to ensure the cost is covered.
- Timeline:
- -RCLC Staff and Daycare -- ASAP
- -Volunteers -- starting with Rally Day, 2023
- This motion received a second and there was discussion on whether the Day Care Staff already received training like this as a DHS requirement, and possibly exceeded this training. Stephen will investigate. The motion was approved.

Little Blessings Day Care – Patty reported that Graduation for Day Care will be April 23rd. She requested extra large print bulletins for the families that will attend. There are two openings for kids in the Day Care. One teacher is still needed to fill out the staff. The State has increased their reimbursement amount. The reading program, where members of the church are volunteering to read to the kids, is going well.

Stewardship – Bryan, Men's Shelter has volunteers for the next two months. The food in the food pantry will be transported over to Men's Shelter. Stewardship is going to work with Elders and the Congregational Life Committee on projects.

Trustees – Dave reported that there will be a Spring clean-up day on April 22nd. Light ballasts have been replaced where needed. Dave is working on a LED replacement plan and all the options that could be utilized to switch to LED's and the costs and practicality of each one.

Unfinished business

LBDC Mission Charter Ad-hoc Committee Report. – That report was received during the Church Administrators report.

New Business

The two new motions were discussed under Future Planning above.

The Voters Meeting Agenda for April 23rd was set.




