

# The Gospel for June

### June 4th, Matthew 28:16-20

The Great Commission

<sup>18</sup> Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

### June 11th, Matthew 9:9-13

The Calling of Matthew

<sup>10</sup> While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. <sup>11</sup> When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

<sup>12</sup> On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. <sup>13</sup> But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

### June 18th, Matthew 9:35

The Workers Are Few

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness."

### June 25th Matthew 10:5a, 21-33

Jesus sent out with the following instructions

<sup>5</sup> These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans...<sup>21</sup> "Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child; children will rebel against their parents and have them put to death. <sup>22</sup> You will be hated by everyone because of me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved...<sup>24</sup> "The student is not above the teacher, nor a servant above his master."

#### Matthew 10:26-33

<sup>26</sup> "So do not be afraid of them, for there is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known. 27 What I tell you in the dark, speak in the daylight; what is whispered in your ear, proclaim from the roofs. <sup>28</sup> Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell. <sup>29</sup> Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care. [a] 30 And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. 31 So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.

32 "Whoever acknowledges me before others, I will also acknowledge before my Father in heaven. 33 But whoever disowns me before others, I will disown before my Father in heaven." "I love you." The only one who can put a period at the end of that sentence is God. For the rest of us, those three words are only the beginning of a longer sentence. I love you...if you love me...because you make me happy...until I chose to love someone else. We are conditional lovers who love because we find something in the other that is lovable.

We sinners love this way because we care most about ourselves. What we really care about is what others can do for us. It's about how they make us feel. Our hope in loving another is that it will result in some benefit to us, some form of improvement in our lives.



God, on the other hand, is an unconditional lover. He is the one and only lover of the unlovable. If we want to know love, then we must know God:


By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. (1 John 3:16)

The way of Christ is the way of true love. It is always love for the other, never love for the self. The self goes without so the other may have. The self suffers so the other may be comforted. The self is sacrificed so the other may live. That's the way of Christ.

If it is the way of Christ, then it is to be the way of those who bear His name. The Christian can't claim ignorance on the subject. To truly know Jesus is to know true love. Because we know Jesus as the one who loves us unconditionally, we recognize then our failure to do the same. We hear His command to love our neighbor and we know how we fail to put a full stop at the end of those words, "I love you."

It is God's command that we love others. But don't think of this command as something that must be done to earn God's love. Remember, God's love is unconditional. The command of God still stands, however, because your neighbor needs your love. Your neighbor needs your sacrificial service. We seek to fulfill the command for the sake of our neighbor.

And when we catch ourselves adding a conditional clause onto the end of that short sentence with an "if" or a "because" or an "until," then we turn to Christ for His love. His unconditional, self-sacrificing love cleanses us for all of our failure to love as He has loved us. And we hear Him put a full stop at the end of His sentence when He cries out from the cross, "It is finished."

# The Athanasian Creed

#### **PART I**

Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith. Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally. And the catholic faith is this, that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance. For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another. But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal. Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit: the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; Men: the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; Women: the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal. And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal, just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite. In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty; and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty. So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; and yet there are not three Gods, but one God. So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; Women: and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord. Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, Men: So also are we prohibited by the catholic Religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

#### PART II

The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding. Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits. Men: And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another; Women: but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped. Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

#### PART III

But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man. He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age: perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh; equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity. Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ: one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God; one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person. For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ, Men: who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead, Women: ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead. Men: At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds. Women: And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire. This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved. Amen.

In a nutshell: sign up for a date, plan a meal, prepare it and serve it with love.






