## August 6th, Matthew 14:13-21 Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

<sup>15</sup> As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."

Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. 20 They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. 21 The number of those who ate was about five thousand men. besides women and children. "



In the Divine Service, after we've just received our Lord's body and blood in and under the bread and the wine in His Supper, we pray in the liturgy, "We give thanks to You, almighty God, that You have refreshed us with this salutary gift." The chief blessing of the Lord's Supper is made clear by the words of Christ's institution: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." The forgiveness of sins, won for us on Calvary and offered in the Sacrament of our Lord's body and blood truly makes this blessed Supper a "salutary gift."

Martin Luther teaches us in his Small Catechism that "where there is the forgiveness of sins there is also life and salvation." Our great need for this salutary gift is highlighted when the Catechism reminds us that "we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment." There could hardly be anything more salutary (beneficial) to a person than forgiveness, life and salvation.

The Church has understood the value of this gift from the days of the Apostles. In Acts 2 we find the early Christians "devoted" to worship that included the "breaking of the bread" (meaning the Lord's Supper) and they participated daily in this worship (Acts 2:42, 46). They obviously took Jesus' directive seriously when He instituted this Sacrament saying, "This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."


Our Lutheran forefathers at the time of the Reformation clearly pointed out their weekly reliance on and rejoicing in this salutary gift. Over against the falsehoods being promoted by their opponents they maintained that they celebrated the Lord's Supper "every Lord's Day and on the other festivals."

So it is with great joy that I look forward to this September when we will begin our weekly reliance on and rejoicing in this salutary gift. I for one, "daily sin much and deserve nothing but punishment." With that confession in my heart and on my lips, I will rejoice in going to the House of the Lord to receive the gifts offered in this blessed sacrament. May the words of a familiar hymn serve as your invitation to do the same:

Jesus comes today with healing, Knocking at my door, appealing, Off'ring pardon, grace, and peace. He Himself makes preparation, And I hear His invitation: "Come and taste the blessed feast. (LSB 620)

I pray that you too will rejoice with me in receiving this "meet, right and salutary" gift, often.





#### **Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention** 40th Biennial Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League, also known as Lutheran Women in Mission, welcomed over 3,500 people to their 40th biennial convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, June 22–25, 2023, under the theme "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations." The convention theme was based on Psalm 33:12–13.

#### 2023-2025 Mission Goal and Mission Grants

The Lutheran Women in Mission voting body adopted a \$2,350,000 mission goal for the 2023–2025 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 31 mission grants, as women and men respond in prayer and mite offerings during the next two years.

## Naomi McCloud attended the Convention as a Young Woman Rep for Iowa East District LWML. Naomi's report as follows:

2023 LWML Convention

"Just a few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations" at the 40<sup>th</sup> Biennial National LWML Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin as a Young Women's Representative for the Iowa East District (that's a mouthful!). As a first-time convention goer, I had no idea what to expect at this gathering, other than a lot of women in purple. I quickly learned, however, that this convention was a BIG DEAL. Over 3,500 women gathered together to worship, listen to speakers, and gather offerings for mite missions. We prayed together, sang together, laughed together, walked along the Riverwalk together, and definitely all spent way too much at the LWML Store and CPH exhibit. Personally, I had the joy of meeting and spending time with 74 other young women from around the country. Together, we learned about LWML, the group's mission, and the ways in which we "young'uns" can get involved and continue to "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations" in our home congregations and districts. I came home absolutely astounded at the ways LWML supports missions here in the US and in 93 countries around the world. Throughout the next 2 years, LWML has pledged to raise \$2,350,000, which will fund 31 individual grants or mission projects. After spending the weekend with these 3,500 faithful women (and a few men), I have no doubt that this goal will be reached. I look forward to becoming more involved in the LWML group here at Risen Christ and thank you all for your faithful and continued support of these Lutheran Women in Mission."
