## A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT SEPTEMBER MESSAGE PAGE 4

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I don't know who first thought of the idea of "Rally Day" to kick off another year of Sunday school and church educational programs, but I think it's a great tradition. We ought to celebrate our time together in God's Word and give thanks for the many who volunteer their time to teach and organize our classes. And even more than just celebrating, we ought to be on our knees in prayer, asking God to bless us through His powerful Word, just as He promises to do, and giving thanks to Him for the opportunity to study His Word and to be nurtured in our faith through our time in the Scriptures.

I'd like to ask that you intentionally pray on a daily basis between now and Sunday, September 10, when we'll celebrate Rally Day. Of course, your prayers are appreciated year-round, but let's do more than just celebrate on one Sunday. Let's pray for God's abundant blessings on the work we're setting out to do to nurture the faith in all our members from the babe in arms to those who are well advanced in years.

As a suggestion to help guide your prayers I'm including below a prayer that especially speaks of our youth and the nurturing of their faith. It comes from a book that I've had from my childhood simply called, "My Prayer Book," and it's a great treasure. I've updated the language a bit from the old "King James" language to make it read a bit easier.

#### Let us pray:


Lord Jesus, Friend of children, who commanded Your church, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven," we pray that You would look with favor on the efforts of our congregation to bring up our little ones in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. We commit our Sunday school, its teachers and officers, its pupils, and visitors, to Your divine care and guidance.

Grant, we pray, Your blessing to the instruction offered in our Sunday school. Cause its teachers always to be impressed with the importance of their work, since theirs is the privilege of molding souls for eternity. Give them wisdom and grace to teach the way of salvation in such a clear and compelling fashion that our children, whom You have bought at the price of Your holy blood, may be ready and eager to receive it. Help them also to support the instruction they give in the classroom by personal virtues and exemplary lives.

Since You alone can give the increase, we ask You, dear Lord, to cause the good seed of Your Word to bring forth fruit a hundredfold in the hearts and lives of our Sunday school children. Give them ready and teachable hearts. Cause them to seek their Creator in the days of their youth. Make them abound in faith, hope, and love. And having been trained up in the way they should go, may they ever abide in it, and even when they are old never depart from it. Grant this for Jesus' sake. Amen.



Another successful summer has gone by. It's amazing how fast time goes by. All our school age children are back in school, and we are working on moving the younger children around to get our new infants into their room.

Our one and only fund raiser has started. We are once again selling the Save Around coupon books. There has been several new businesses added to the book this year. The books sell for \$25.00 and the daycare receives \$12.50 for each book sold. We will have some sitting out in the fellowship hall if anyone is interested in a coupon book.

The organization was founded by Phil Zielke who is a two time stage 4 cancer survivor. 
