A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT DECEMBER MESSAGE PAGE 4

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation" (Zech 9:9), so begins the Introit for the First Sunday in Advent. It's a season of preparation. Mostly, we tend to think of it as a time to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth. And while it does help prepare us for that celebration, we miss the most important part of these preparations if we overlook Advent also as a season to set our focus on the Second Coming of Christ.

Looking ahead to the promised Second Coming of our King properly sets our focus to celebrate His First Coming. If Jesus is not going to come again with "righteousness and having salvation," then a celebration of His birth is little more than an observance of some historical event. We need Him to come again with His righteousness and His salvation, otherwise we are without hope because "none is righteous, no, not one" (Rom 3:9).

That's why Advent properly begins at the end so we can rightly understand and celebrate the beginning. If the end doesn't end with us having salvation, then the beginning isn't worth celebrating. If the end doesn't end with someone who has righteousness to give us, then we'll have no salvation because we are all unrighteous and the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God (1 Cor 6:9).

We need a Savior who is not just a cute baby lying in a manger. We need something more than a Hallmark card Nativity Scene and a Norman Rockwell setting for our Christmas family gathering. We need a real, righteous Savior who comes to deal with real, unrighteous sinners. We need a Savior who comes not to excuse, or overlook, or redefine our sin, but one that comes to call sin sin and do something about it. Only a righteous Savior could do that. Only a righteous Savior could be the substitute for all sinners—the righteous for the unrighteous.

If this baby is to bring "peace on earth, good will toward men," (Lk 2:14) then He would need to be one who would cry from the cross, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34).

This very same Savior now comes to you, "righteous and having salvation." Where? Altar. Font. Pulpit. Lectern. Book. Pastor. Bread. Wine. Water. In these gifts He comes delivering righteousness and salvation. Because of these gifts we can say with confidence, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

Because we have a Savior who comes into our midst now to forgive us and make us righteous, we can look ahead with joy to the day when He has


promised to return in glory. On that day all those who are righteous, that is, all who trust in Him and Him alone for their salvation, will be gathered into His eternal kingdom. Knowing that joyous end that awaits us, we sing with confidence as we celebrate the joy His birth brought to the world:

No more let sins and sorrows grow Nor thorns infest the ground; He comes to make His blessings flow Far as the curse is found, Far as the curse is found Far as, far as the curse is found. (LSB 387:3)

May this Advent season point you ahead to the Coming One so you can look back with joy as you celebrate the birth of Jesus.



This grant will help purchase two vans to transport high school students enrolled in the School-to-Work Internship Program and students taking elective classes at nearby

Martin Luther High School.





The Reporter: November 'Witness': What is Truth?

Excerpt, Written By: Rev. Roy Askins is the managing editor of The Lutheran Witness. "What is truth?" Pilate asked Jesus, who stood accused of sins not His own (John 18:38). The question still stands: "What is truth?" it's been asked in a variety of ways since the life, death and resurrection of Christ. It's been answered in almost as many ways. The modern world tends to look toward the emotions of the heart. What makes you feel good? What feels right in your heart? If that's what you feel is right, it must be your truth. When we disagree with others rather than digging for the truth, we might dismiss them with, "Well, that's just your perspective." and, to be sure, in some cases it might simply be a matter of perspective..." 'Seek the truth,' indeed," writes the Rev. Christopher Esget in his article. "But have no doubt about where to find it—in the Word of God—or what it cost—the life of Christ."
