A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT FEBRUARY MESSAGE PAGE +

Drop Your Ugly Accusation!

Satan is the great accuser. He accuses you of being unworthy of God's mercy. He wants to hold your sins in front of you, convince you they are so terrible that God could never forgive you, and leave you despairing of your salvation. Satan wants to fix your eyes on your sin. But God says, "Fix your eyes on Jesus" (Heb 12:2). With your eyes on Jesus, you will know that no matter the depth of your sin, there is "no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Rom 8:1).

Which is what makes the gift of confessing our sins to God so great. As King David so elegantly put it: "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,' and you forgave the iniquity of my sin" (Ps 32:5). David rejoiced in the gift of confessing his sins and receiving God's forgiveness.

Martin Luther spoke boldly of the confidence we have even when the devil tries to convict us of our sins. Luther suggests we "Spit at the devil and say: If I have sinned, well, then I have sinned, and I am sorry about it; but Christ has taken away all the sins of all the world... Therefore this sin of mine is certainly also taken away. Depart from me, devil. I am absolved."

Apply that same confidence to your meditation on the Second Commandment this month with the catechism explanation and questions to guide your meditation printed below. Confess your sins and then tell the devil to get lost with these words from the third verse of *God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It* (LSB 594):

Satan, hear this proclamation: I am baptized into Christ! Drop your ugly accusation, I am not so soon enticed. Now that to the font I've traveled, All your might has come unraveled, And, against your tyranny, God, my Lord, unites with me!

God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith. Amen.

The Second Commandment You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

Questions for Self-Reflection:

Is the Lord's Word evident in my daily speech and conduct, or do I curse, speak carelessly, or misuse God's name?

Do I keep all the vows I have made in the Lord's name, such as confirmation, marriage, or legal vows, etc.?

Am I diligent and sincere in my prayers, or have I been lazy, bored, or distracted? Do I trust that the

Lord God will answer them according to His good and

gracious will?



The weather made January very interesting for the daycare. A couple late starts and a couple days we closed for weather. Life is so much easier not having to change the schedules around, but using Brightwheel all parents received notifications immediately of the change in schedule and was much easier this year.

January we were able to get our parent handbook updated. The state has added many new mandates that needed to be added to our parent handbook. If anyone would like to look at our parent handbook, please stop in the daycare and we can give you a copy. Next project is to update our staff handbook. Once again state has added several new policies that need to be included in our handbook.

This is February's project. The preschool children will be having a special "event" for the congregation that is involved with Lifelight this month on Valentine's day. Make sure you show up if you're in the class that day. We are starting up our reading to preschoolers again this month. A new sign up chart will be in the fellowship hall. If you're interested in reading to the children, pick a day that works best for you and we will have the children ready to be good listeners. The children love it when someone new is reading to them and this is a wonderful way of showing God's love to the children and the children showing God's love back.

Check out the pictures on the daycare bulletin board in the hallway. Who says one year old's can't pray during the Lord's prayer and before they are served meals each day. They are so precious and show they are God's children. During a zoom meeting with Jan Doellinger (IDE Assistant to the President - Schools) she shared an article written by Drew Gerdes about God Loves You. In the article it talks about how many times and ways to tell children "God Loves You" in a day and how powerful those words are. "God loves you" can be said, read and written to children depending on ages. Look at your own family and friends that you are with everyday. How many times can you say, read or write those words to family and friends?

February is a great month to work on telling family and friends that God loves them. During the month of February the children will be working and learning about: • The color blue and Jesus calming the storm. When someone is described as "true blue" it means that he/she is completely trustworthy. It is important that the children know whom they can trust. Letter w, number 3 color blue shape triangle little boy blue nursery rhyme and the bible verse is: Quiet Be still Mark 4:39 • Valentine's day and the good Samaritan. Encourage the children to show appreciation and affection to others. The focus of this theme is not only about loving family and friends but also about being a good neighbor to everyone we meet. Letter x number 4 color red shape heart Jesus loves me nursery rhyme and bible verse: who is my neighbor? • This theme is about celebrating President's day and discussing important leaders of the Bible. Children can understand the presidential position as one of authority. They can begin to appreciate the characteristics of a godly leader.

Letter y number 5 color red/while/blue shape rectangle and old king cole for nursery rhyme. Bible verse is: give us a king to lead us The center is still looking to hire one to two more staff members. 
PRAYERS related to this Mission Grant:
