

Our Penitential Season

The season of Lent is referred to as a "penitential season" because of its emphasis on sin as the reason for Christ's suffering and death. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes with Good Friday. It is good, right, and salutary that we reflect on our sin that we might properly understand both of those days. Ashes on our foreheads declare to us the consequence of our sin: "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." Jesus on the cross teaches us how Jesus took that consequence for us in our place. It is the price that had to be paid, as Luther puts it in his explanation to the Second Article of the Creed: "[Jesus] purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death..."

We're reviewing one commandment a month to help us realize that such reflection on and confession of our sin bears fruit in our lives all year long and not just in the season of Lent. As we have arrived at the Third Commandment, I pray that your meditation on its teaching this month will lead you to a deeper appreciation of God's powerful Word at work to turn you in repentance from your sin and to the One who saves you from your sin.

With our hope firmly anchored in Christ by the power of His Word we discover the joy of living in repentance and His forgiveness. Soon we find that a 40-day penitential season only leaves us longing of more. Yes, the Christian heart longs to turn from its sin and toward its Savior. The Christian heart knows what it is to live in the peace of a lifelong penitential season. From the cradle of our baptism to our grave we live in repentant faith and each day we grow in our understanding of King David's words:

Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation, And my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness. (Ps 51:14)

God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith. Amen.

Questions for Self-Reflection:

Do I pray for my pastor and other church workers and support their efforts in service to the Word?

to attend church on Sundays and read the Scriptures at home during the week, privately or with your family?


Do you make going to church a low priority in relation to other things?





2023-2025 LWML Mission Grant #8 Expanding Gospel Proclamation Worldwide

Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO — \$100,000

The LCMS receives frequent requests from other Lutheran church bodies around the world to share theological knowledge and doctrinally sound practices. Supporting and expanding theological education is one of LCMS's key mission priorities to ensure there will be well-educated pastors to lead these congregations. Very few of these church bodies have the resources to send students to the United States for advanced studies and there is a need for seminary professors who have advanced theological degrees to instruct and mentor pastoral students in their home countries.

God has equipped our seminary professors to fill this gap. International students will come to Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, to complete advanced degrees, and they will return to their country to train pastors who will then shepherd their local churches. This grant will provide aid to international students

completing their advanced degrees.

Pray for Our Theology Students:

Dear heavenly Father, as international students come to grow in their knowledge of You, please empower them with Your Word and Sacraments to complete the task which is ahead of them. Please guide and protect them so that they can return to their home countries and spread the knowledge of You that they have learned at Concordia Seminary. Alan Furst is a Ph.D. student from Ipiranga do Norte, Brazil. A member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Brazil (IELB), he earned a bachelor's degree in theology in 2013 from the Lutheran University of Brazil and, in 2016, earned a master's degree in theology from the IELB's seminary in São Leopoldo. After he earns his Ph.D., he expects to be called to serve a congregation. It is IELB policy that one must serve a parish for a minimum of five years before becoming a seminary professor.

Rev. Aiji Komiyama is a Ph.D. student from Kobe, Japan. A pastor in the West Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church, he earned a Master of Divinity degree from Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary in 2011 and a Master of Sacred Theology degree from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind., in 2020. From 2011 -17, he served as pastor for Kita-Suzurandai Lutheran Church (Kita-Suzurandai, Japan). After he earns his Ph.D., he will become a professor at Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary.




