The Gospel for July



July 7th Mark 6:1-13 Jesus Sends Out the Twelve Apostles

¹⁰ "And he said to them, "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you depart from there. ¹¹ And if any place will not receive you and they will not listen to you, when you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." ¹² So they went out and proclaimed that people should repent. ¹³ And they cast out many demons and anointed with oil many who were sick and healed them."

July 14th Mark 6:14-29 The Death of John the Baptist

²² "For when Herodias's daughter came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests. And the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it to you."²³ And he vowed to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom."²⁴ And she went out and said to her mother, "For what should I ask?" And she said, "The head of John the Baptist."²⁵ And she came in immediately with haste to the king and asked, saying, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." ²⁶ And the king was exceedingly sorry, but because of his oaths and his guests he did not want to break his word to her.²⁷ And immediately the king sent an executioner with orders to bring John's^[d] head. He went and beheaded him in the prison ²⁸ and brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother.²⁹ When his disciples heard of it, they came and took his body and laid it in a tomb."

July 28th Mark 6:45-56 Jesus Walks on the Water

⁵⁰ "for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." ⁵¹ "And he got into the boat with them, and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded."

Mark 6:30-44

Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

³³ "Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they ran there on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. ³⁴ When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them many things. ³⁵ And when it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the hour is now late. ³⁶ Send them away to go into the surrounding countryside and villages and buy themselves something to eat." 37 But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." And they said to him, "Shall we go and buy two hundred denarii^[a] worth of bread and give it to them to eat?" ³⁸ And he said to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go and see." And when they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." ³⁹ Then he commanded them all to sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰ So they sat down in groups, by hundreds and by fifties. ⁴¹ And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing and broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the people. And he divided the two fish among them all.⁴² And they all ate and were satisfied. ⁴³ And they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. ⁴⁴ And those who ate the loaves were five thousand men."

Season of Pentecost: A Season of Repentance

We are in the season of Pentecost, the longest season of the Church Year. Pentecost begins when the Season of Easter ends and concludes when Advent begins. It stretches across the summer months into the fall.

The Day of Pentecost that begins the season finds us with red paraments in the chancel. Red signifies the Holy Spirit and reminds us how the Holy Spirit was poured out on the believers in Jerusalem in a marvelous, miraculous way ten days after Jesus ascended into heaven. The Spirit made His presence and work known with the sound of a mighty wind, tongues of fire, and the ability to speak in languages not previously learned. Though the color red begins the season, the Sundays after Pentecost use green. Green is the color of growing plants. Plants that grow and thrive require water and nourishment. So the Church grows as we live in the waters of Baptism and are nourished through the Lord's Word and Sacraments.

Led by the Holy Spirit, Peter preached a powerful sermon on that first Pentecost Sunday. Many who heard him preach were convicted of their sin, or "cut to the heart," as the book of Acts describes it. They asked Peter what they should do and he told them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:37-38).

Pentecost first began with a call to repentance, and so it continues today. Christ's Church grows as we sinners persistently respond to the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit that leads us to repent and receive the forgiveness of sins. May you be blessed with spiritual growth this Pentecost as you reflect on the Seventh Commandment, letting yourself be "cut to the heart," so that you might flourish in the forgiveness of your sins.

God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit bless your penitential meditation this month. God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith. Amen.

Do I take care of what I have, pay what I owe, return what I borrow, and respect other people's property? Do I give generously, or am I selfish, stingy, and greedy with my time and money? Am I unfaithful to the responsibilities of my vocation? (From *Lutheran Service Book, Pastoral Care Companion, CPH, 2007*)

Do you take what belongs to others? Do you cause any damage or harm to the possessions of another? Are you lazy, or do you fail to work for others as if it is for the Lord? (From *Preparation through Reflective and Introspective Examination, Emmanuelpress.us)*




Learning to Think Biblically

<u>District (Iowa East District) Convention News:</u> <u>SHOUT IT OUT! PRAISE THE LORD!</u>

This was the theme for the convention. Friday's attendance = 184 and Saturday was 225. God blessed the convention in various ways:

The blessing of opportunity to worship - opening worship at 1 pm on Friday The blessing of generous hearts:

- Offering #1 = \$3,511 to be applied to the IED 2024-2026 Mission Goal
- Offering #2 = \$1,620 for Iowa County Food Bank
- MegaMites monies raised for Mites = \$3,809.28
- Ingathering for Community Lutheran School (Klinger/Readlyn), Lutheran Interparish School (Williamsburg), and Swaddling Clothes (ministry in Marengo) raised an additional amount of over \$4,200.00 plus many items such as clothing items, diapers, copy paper, etc..

We praise God for the generous hearts of our LWML IED women.

The blessing of studying God's Word with the two Bible Studies – presented by the two Pastoral Counselors for IED. Review of Isaiah 12: 1-6 and How do we Praise and Shout to the Lord: A Life of Vocation Opportunity for fellowship with our LWML sisters

Hearing about mission efforts from those who have received grants in the past. The willingness to trust God to provide <u>\$73,500 and \$30,000</u> for mission grants and church worker student scholarships (respectively) for the next Biennium! 2024-2026. The mission grant request submitted by RCLC's LWML for the Rev. Samuel Bobby who is in Latvia, teaching at the Luther Academy, the seminary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Latvia. The request for \$7,500 was among grants chosen.

Equipping women through God's Word: We continue to offer opportunities for Bible study – We met on June 6 and heard about various women who God called and equipped for various tasks (OT and NT). Then, we reviewed Scripture that gives us insight to God's plan for women today. Check out: John 3:16, Ephesians 3: 16-19, John 8: 32; 2 Timothy 3:16-17, 1 John 5: 13-20; 1 Cor. 12. In July, we will not meet – watch for information about our August 1st Bible study. Another Bible study opportunity: Every Sunday morning at 10:30 a.m. with Pastor Licht



2023–2025 Mission Grant #12 Sharing Christ Crucified with High School Youth Lutheran High School of Greater New Orleans, LA – \$35,000

Lutheran High School of Greater New Orleans, the only high school in the LCMS Southern District, has been serving youth for over 50 years. It provides students with the opportunity to academically succeed in a safe environment, while educating them about their Lord and Savior through the teachings of the LCMS. Many of the students being served by the school are disadvantaged, culturally diverse, and unchurched. Because the school was devastated by Hurricane Ida, funds which would have been used for computers, school supplies, Christian materials, and scholarship aid are now being used for construction costs to rebuild one of the buildings.

This grant will be matched by five generous donors and will be used to pay the tuition costs of ten students.



After Hurricane Ida, Lutheran High School had to remove a huge amount of asbestos.

Lord, we give You thanks for teachers and volunteers at Lutheran High School of Greater New Orleans. 

Lutherans Meet in D.C. to discuss church & state

On April 17-18, 16 panelists and 14 specially invited guests gathered at the Museum of the Bible in Washington, D.C., for a colloquium on church and state issues as they relate to theologically conservative Christians. The colloquium, titled "Lutheran Participation in Politics: A Conversation on the Challenges of the American Context," was sponsored by the LCMS Office of the President and Lutheran Church Extension Fund.

In the wake of increasing hostility to Christian convictions from an increasingly secularized society, the conference organizers—the Rev. Dr. Richard J. Serina Jr., devised the conference as a way to connect those in the Synod with background and interest in these issues. They described it as both a conversation and catalyst: a conversation about how Lutherans should engage the political challenges and tensions they face in this culture, and a catalyst for how they might work together in the future.


