# A WORD FROM PASTOR LICHT NOVEMBER MESSAGE PAGE 4

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In these newsletter articles we've spent the last ten months reviewing the commandments as a guide for confessing our sins. Along the way we looked at the catechism explanations plus a series of Questions specific to each commandment to help us uncover the weaknesses of our flesh and our failures to live according to God's commands. Such meditative reflection will bear fruit in our lives, and it will help us to more fully appreciate the gift of forgiveness that flows out upon us in every Divine Service. It will also lead us to value the gift of privately confessing our sins to our pastor, knowing that he has been called to speak the forgiving word of Christ to us in the stead of our Lord.

The gift of private confession and absolution with a called servant of Christ, who has vowed to never divulge the sins confessed to him, is perhaps the most neglected gift our Lord gave to His Church.

Receiving absolution personally for the sins that you have just acknowledged out loud is like a laser guided missile striking its target. It leaves no doubt that your specific sins have been wiped out by the blood of your Savior who took those very sins as His own and died for them.

The practice of private confession and absolution is a great and precious gift. Gifts from our Lord are always received by faith with thanksgiving. They are not something that can be forced on anyone by coercion. Which makes our Lutheran heritage such a joyful thing. I'll let Luther's words from his Large Catechism unpack this gift that he helped uncover for the Church through his faithful teaching:

"We have always urged that confession should be voluntary and that the pope's tyranny should cease. As a result we are now rid of his coercion and set free from the intolerable load and burden that he laid upon Christendom. ... Everyone is now aware of this. But unfortunately people have learned it only too well. They do as they please and apply their freedom wrongfully as if it meant that they ought not or must not go to confession. ... Nevertheless, we strongly urge you by all means to make confession of your need, not with the intention of thereby doing a worthy work but in order to hear what God has arranged for you to be told. What I am saying is that you are to concentrate on the Word, on the absolution, to regard it as a great and precious and magnificently splendid treasure, and to accept it with all praise and thanksgiving to God."

If you are unfamiliar with this gift it might help to look at the Rite of Individual Confession and Absolution on pages 292-293 of our hymnal. That may dispel some of the mystery and help prepare you to receive this "magnificently splendid treasure." Then call me to set up a time to receive the gift so together we can rejoice and give thanks to our merciful Lord.

The Lord be merciful to you and strengthen your faith. Pastor Licht





# Expanding Gospel Outreach to Hispanics in U.S. 2023–2025 Mission Grant #22 — \$100,000

Hispanics have become the second largest ethnic population in the United States and Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) realizes that there are many opportunities to reach out with the Gospel using Christian resources that are available through media and outreach technology.

LHM is not simply translating



English materials into Spanish, they are crafting programming, media content, and written materials for Hispanics by Hispanics. These are applicable to daily life in the American culture and help to spread the Gospel. Working with LCMS ministry leaders, churches, districts, universities, and seminaries, LHM has been able to reach out to more of the Hispanic population.

This grant will share God's message of salvation with the Hispanic people through technology in their own language, which will help strengthen their faith and encourage them to seek to learn more about Jesus.

### 2023–2025 Mission Grant #19 Tanzania Children's Homes

### Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania, Africa — \$74,500

#### PAID IN FULL!

The Tanzania Children's Home welcomes albino children to offer security, care, and education. Albinism (limited melanin pigment in the skin, eyes, and hair) is especially prevalent in Tanzania. Children with albinism face health risks of skin cancer and visual impairment and are threatened by the pagan practices of the tribal religions that falsely teach their body parts have magical powers to make one rich, successful, and powerful. The home offers security and specialized care for the children that their families cannot provide and is located on the campus of the Lutheran Boarding School in Mwadui. They are raised in the knowledge and love of the Lord and are transported to the Mwadui Lutheran Secondary School for their education. This grant will help purchase a bus for safe transportation of the children and will contribute to the support of the children.



In July 2022, a group from St. John, Bingen (Decatur, IN) travelled to Tanzania to meet the pastors, deaconesses, church leaders, and children at the home they funded for their 175th anniversary.

#### PRAYERS FOR THOSE SERVED THROUGH THIS MISSION GRANT

**PRAYER #1** Heavenly Father, we ask You to protect the albino children in Tanzania. They face physical problems due to the lack of pigmentation in their skin. The risk of sunburn and skin cancer is high. The greatest challenge is the isolation they face as sometimes they may be ostracized from their own home. Provide people who will care for them and protect them. It is through Your power that they will be kept safe. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

**PRAYER #2** Jesus, we ask You to protect the albino children from evil superstitions. We cannot begin to understand how anyone would cut off the hand of a child and sell it as a potion for wealth and prosperity. The evil is so great and only You have the power to contain it. We pray for protection for the children, and we also pray for the followers of evil superstitions. Enter the hearts of the witch doctors and replace the evil with Your love and forgiveness so that this terrible practice will stop. We pray in Your name. Amen.

**PRAYER #3** Lord, we ask You to be with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania as they spread the Gospel throughout the country. Bless the leaders and pastors that their teaching will bear fruit. We ask You to be with the leaders in the Mwadui area as they reach out to protect the children suffering from albinism. Guide them as they offer physical protection but also share with them the saving words of the Gospel. Albino children can feel isolated, but we know that You welcome them into Your loving arms as Your children. In Jesus' name. Amen.

An albino child is characterized by the partial or complete absence of pigment in the skin, hair, and eyes. Lack of skin pigmentation makes for more susceptibility to sunburn and skin cancers. In Tanzania, albinos represent one in every 1429 births, a much higher rate than in any other nation. Albinos are especially persecuted because witch doctors have promoted a belief in the magical and superstitious properties of albinos' body parts. An albino child is often seen as a bad omen and treated as unwanted. Children may have their hands or arms amputated and sold to witch doctors. Parents of albino children will protect their children by sending them to an orphanage that will offer more security than their own home. The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania — Southeast of Lake Victoria Diocese (ELCK — SELVD) currently has a teaching center for training church leaders in Mwadui where there are a high percentage of albino children. The church is growing through baptisms and evangelism. On the campus of the teaching center is the Lutheran Boarding School. In 2021, an orphanage was built on the campus to provide a home and school for albino children. The orphanage, sponsored by the ELCK — SELVD is safer and more secure for the children than the government run orphanage. Since the orphanage is located next to the Lutheran boarding school, the albino children are integrated into a more normal life and are not isolated. The most important care they receive is that their body and soul are served as they are cared for, and they are reared in the fear and instruction of the Lord. The purpose of the grant is to purchase a school bus to transport children from their homes to school and to assist with the funding of the children's care.

The school provides for their bodily needs as they are threatened by health risks, and protects them from the pagan practices. They are built up in their faith and are children of God.

The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore (Psalm 121:7–8).



Hurricane Helen: Amid Heartache, abiding peace By Cheryl Magness, The Reporter Online

When Hurricane Helene came ashore near Perry, Fla., as a Category 4 storm on Sept. 26, those in its path knew it could be serious. Weeks later, the estimated death toll stands at almost 250 people across seven states. Within days of Helene's landfall, the Rev. Dr. Ross Johnson, director of LCMS Disaster Response, took a multi-day trip to the affected areas. He reported that the impact in Florida consisted primarily of flooding; in Georgia, wind damage; and in North Carolina, both. In North Carolina, Helene packed a double whammy of wind and water, necessitating both extensive chainsaw work and flood recovery. LCMS Southeastern District (SED) President Rev. Dr. William Harmon noted, "It's such a unique event to have a hurricane hit the mountains of North and South Carolina. 'Lots of Miracles' The Rev. Bryan Chestnutt, pastor of Mountainside, sees the hurricane as an opportunity for his congregation to be a light to a community in need. Harmon said the greatest needs continue to be water, especially in Asheville; food; hygiene kits; flood cleanup kits; volunteers; money; and, of course, prayer.
