THE GREAT FIFTY DAYS

We celebrated the day of our Lord's Resurrection on April 20 th . But our celebrating is not yet over. Easter is more than a single day on the Church calendar, it is a season of 50 days, sometimes referred to as "The Great Fifty Days."

Mary Magdalene was the first to encounter Jesus after His resurrection. But when she first saw Him, she didn't really see Him. By her way of reckoning things Jesus was still dead because dead people stay dead. She assumed Him instead to be a grave-tampering, body-moving gardener. Then He spoke her name, "Mary!" And she turned and said to Him, "Rabboni!" Her beloved Teacher was alive, risen! Risen indeed! Alleluia! (You can read this beautiful account in John 20:1-18, which is the traditional Gospel reading for Easter Sunrise).

With her eyes now open to see her resurrected Lord, everything was changed. Her sorrow was turned to joy. A tomb was now a place of life. A grave-tampering gardener now a resurrection-giving gardener. This wasn't news to keep to herself. This was news to share, and so she went and announced it to the disciples.

The resurrection of our Lord has indeed changed everything. He's not a gardener who tries to spruce up death by planting daisies on your grave and trimming the grass around your tombstone. He's the Gardener who takes the seed of your body planted in your tomb and causes it to sprout again to new, eternal life. Because Jesus went through death and brought life from it, now life comes from things like cancer, sickness, pain, tragedy, and death.

Like Mary, He has called us each by name so that we too can see what type of Gardener He is. He called you forth, by name, on the day of your baptism. That day He called you out of the death of sin into the life of His kingdom. He has opened your eyes to see Him tending to you, nurturing your life, as He waters you from the fount, blows the cooling breeze of His breath over you in Absolution, prunes away your diseased branches with His Law, causes the blossoms of good fruit to sprout with His Gospel, and strengthens you with the good fertilizer of His own Body and Blood in the Supper.

This news is too good to keep to ourselves. That's why the Church gives Easter not just a single day, but a 50-day season. It's a "week of weeks" between Easter and Pentecost that includes the celebration of our Lord's Ascension.

During these weeks the Divine Service proclaims Easter with its white

vestments, alleluias, and Scripture readings that tell of our risen Lord.

And we don't stop there. Our Lord's resurrection has changed everything, so we proclaim it in all that we do—not just during the season of Easter. If He had not risen from the tomb we would have no hope. But because "on the third day He rose again from the dead," we see everything with new eyes—eyes that see joy, even when they are spilling over with tears of sorrow, eyes that see not a cemetery, but a garden that will burst forth with life on the Last Day; eyes that see our resurrected Gardener tending to us

and using all things to work together for our growth and life in His good and eternal garden.

That's the message we've been given to proclaim. It's the good news of our Savior's triumph over death that resounds throughout heaven and echoes forth in our speech and song here on earth.

Now all the vault of heav'n resounds
In praise of love that still abounds;
"Christ has triumphed! He is living!"
Sing, choirs of angels, loud and clear!
Repeat their song of glory here:
"Christ has triumphed! Christ has triumphed!"
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! (LSB 465)







Breaking Generational Poverty in Detroit

Camp Restore Detroit, MI - \$58,988.62 (partial)

Camp Restore Detroit has been called to be a partner in breaking the cycle of generational poverty in Detroit by working with families and community leaders in a Christ-centered atmosphere, where families can learn and grow with access to education and needed resources.

Camp Restore Detroit fills the Children's Outreach House, Adult Outreach House, and the land surrounding it with programs and ministry aimed at sharing God's love as they work together to restore hope, support health and wellness, raise the educational levels of children and adults, and support vocational skill building in a Christ-centered environment.

This grant will fund furnishings for both houses, tools for learning including Bibles, SMARTboards, and computers. Additionally, a Maker's Space and a Storybook Learning and Reading Garden for community members and their children will be created.



So many relationships are formed through the work of Camp Restore Detroit. Two little boys, one from the community and the other, a Lutheran from a different city, worshipping together. One is teaching the other about the use of the LCMS hymnel and enthusiastically sharing the love of Jesus with one another.
