# The Gospel for November



## November 2, Matthew 5:1-12

### *The Sermon on the Mount*

**5** Seeing the crowds, he went up on the mountain, and when he sat down, his disciples came to him.

**2** And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying:

**11** "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. **12** Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

## November 9, Luke 20:27-40

### *Sadducees Ask About the Resurrection*

**27** There came to him some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, **28** and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man<sup>[a]</sup> must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. **34** And Jesus said to them, "The sons of this age marry and are given in marriage, **35** but those who are considered worthy to attain to that age and to the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage, **36** for they cannot die anymore, because they are equal to angels and are sons of God, being sons<sup>[b]</sup> of the resurrection.

## November 16, Luke 21:5-28

### *Jesus Foretells Destruction of the Temple*

**5** And while some were speaking of the temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, he said, **6** "As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." **7** And they asked him, "Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?" **8** And he said, "See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is at hand!' Do not go after them. **9** And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once."

## November 23, Luke 23:27-43

### *The Crucifixion*

**39** One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him,<sup>[d]</sup> saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" **40** But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? **41** And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." **42** And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." **43** And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."

## November 30, Matthew 21:1-11

### *The Triumphal Entry*

**21** Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, **2** saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. **3** If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." **4** This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

**5** "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt,<sup>[a]</sup> the foal of a beast of burden.'"

By the time you read this, we will have already celebrated Reformation Day and will be quickly moving toward Advent. Both of these celebrations in the Church Year bring to mind change and transformation. The Reformation brought change to the Christian Church, transforming it from a church that obscured the work of Christ to a church that boldly proclaimed His saving work. It's a change that spilled out from the Church into the rest of the world. Advent finds us anticipating the transformation of the world beginning with our Savior's arrival as a babe in a manger. That world-changing Good News first spilled out into the world as the shepherds who visited the Christ child returned to their flocks "glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told" (Luke 2:20).

The change ushered in by the Reformation is really nothing more (and nothing less) than the change brought by our Savior's advent as the son of Mary. The world was turned upside down when Immanuel, God with us, arrived as that swaddling-clothed babe. The world would never be the same after the Word-made-flesh came to demonstrate that worldly wealth, wisdom, and power are of no value in the kingdom of God.

The Reformation began with Luther's attempt to make this point clear in his battle against the selling of indulgences. It isn't earthly wealth, Luther proclaimed, that frees souls from hell, but the holy precious blood and the innocent suffering and death of Jesus Christ. This is the world-transforming message that we call the Gospel. It's the same

message that was proclaimed to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden when God promised that the offspring of a woman would defeat Satan (Gen. 3:15)

It's the same transforming message that the Church continues to proclaim today. By it hearts are changed from ones that seek after worldly wealth and self-gratification to hearts that find true wealth and satisfaction only in Jesus Christ. Without the Gospel hearts conform themselves to the world and its ways. With the Gospel hearts are transformed to discern the will of God and His ways.

*Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.*

Romans 12:2

The transforming love of Jesus has reformed your heart. Now His love spills out from you onto your neighbor. Hearts changed by the Gospel change the world one neighbor at a time. These Gospel-changed hearts never stop sharing the transforming message of sins forgiven.

And along with that message goes demonstrable acts of kindness and love to back up the message; it's a package deal that can't be broken apart.

Yes, God is at work transforming this broken world. Reformation celebrations and the season of Advent serve to remind us that the transforming work of the Gospel will not be done until Jesus Advents again, with the shout of an archangel and the blast of a trumpet.

May your transformed heart always rejoice in the overflowing love of Christ Jesus, as His love spills out from you to reform and transform this world in which we live.




