

The Gospel for January



January 11, Matthew 3:13-17

The Baptism of Jesus

¹³ Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. ¹⁴ John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" ¹⁵ But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. ¹⁶ And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, ^[a] and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; ¹⁷ and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, ^[b] with whom I am well pleased."

January 18, John 1:29-42a

Behold, the Lamb of God

²⁹ The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! ³⁰ This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me.' ³¹ I myself did not know him, but for this purpose I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." ³² And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. ³³ I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' ³⁴ And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son ^[a] of God."

January 25, Matthew 4:12-25

Jesus Calls the First Disciples

¹⁸ While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." ^[b] ²⁰ Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ²¹ And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. ²² Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

January 4, Luke 2:40-52

The Boy Jesus in the Temple

⁴¹ Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. ⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. ⁴³ And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, ⁴⁴ but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, ⁴⁵ and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸ And when his parents ^[a] saw him, they were astonished. And his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great distress." ⁴⁹ And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ^[b] ⁵⁰ And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. ⁵¹ And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart. ² And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature ^[c] and in favor with God and man.

Happy New Year! It's how we greet one another around the turn of the year. And indeed, it's our heartfelt desire that the new year will be a happy one for everyone. Yet none of us can know what the future will bring. The Christian is no better off in this regard than the unbeliever. A child of God can't see into the future anymore than a child of the world. But what the child of God can see, through the lens of Holy Scripture, is the heart of his heavenly Father.

Whether poorer or richer in the coming year, God's children know they'll lack nothing necessary. “*Therefore do not be anxious, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you*” (Mt 6:31-33).

Will there be more suffering or joy in the next 365 days? No one can say. But even in the midst of suffering, God's children know the never-failing love of their heavenly Father. “*For the Lord will not cast off forever, for, though he cause grief, he will have compassion according to the abundance of his steadfast love*” (Lam 3:31-32). Even more, children of God cling to His promise to turn even the evils of this world into good. “*And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose*” (Rm 8:28).


Might there be severe testing of one's faith in the coming year? Possibly. Yet however weak one's faith may prove to be, God's children know that “*a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench*” (Is 42:3).

And finally, neither the believer nor the unbeliever knows whether this year might be his last. However, children of God know this: “*For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's*” (Rm 14:7-8). God's children know that to go on living is to live the life that's been preordained by the Lord for His purposes. On the other hand, the Lord's children trust that “*though [they] die, yet shall [they] live*” (John 11:25). Eternal life is the destiny that awaits God's children where “*death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away*” (Rev 21:4).

Therefore, dear child loved by God, don't face the coming year with hesitancy or anxiety of any kind. Live in confidence that whatever path your heavenly Father leads you on in the coming year is a path that takes you through His kingdom of grace as He walks with you, along the trail He has mapped out that will ultimately end with you in His eternal kingdom of glory.







The PreK Class celebrated Jesus’ birth by having a birthday party and making a birthday cake and singing happy birthday.




Moving forward to the New Year we have our first Bible Story, which is about Seasons, the Bible Verse is from Ecclesiastes 3:1

The core of Phil's Friends mission is based on Matthew 25:36, I was sick and you visited me. In the past 18 years, Phil's Friends has sent nearly 60,000 care packages and more than one million Cards of Hope. This ministry supports anyone with cancer regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, or income level.

It costs \$100 for one year to support a cancer patient. This total includes the care package, 12 Cards of Hope, and postage. The care packages are hand-decorated, and the contents are customized according to the age and gender of the recipient. They are filled with simple, practical comfort items that cancer patients can use during their treatments. Phil's Friends is 100% donor supported.

This grant will purchase supplies for care packages and Cards of Hope and will pay for shipping and postage to support 1,000 cancer patients for one year.

At this event, several church members even selected special items to go into a care package they would deliver personally.

Even before a patient opens a box, they are encouraged! We've heard stories. There are some very clever and artistic people out there, and this is just one example of how beautifully these boxes are decorated. This one will surely bring a smile to a cancer patient's face.



Men's Shelter Meal Service

Where: 2209 3rd Avenue, Rock Island, IL

When: The fourth Thursday night of each month. Arrive at the shelter between 5:00- 5:30 pm, depending on meal prep time required.

What: We provide a meal for 50-60 people.

Details: Meal items can be prepared ahead of time and heated up at the shelter. They have 2 big ovens that we can use. They provide serving dishes, utensils, plates, drinks and clean-up. We provide a tasty nourishing meal (main dish, side dishes, dessert.).
