

The Gospel for August



August 4th John 6:22-35 I Am the Bread of Life

³⁵ Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst."

August 11th John 6:35-51 I Am the Living Bread

⁵¹ I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Words of Eternal Life

⁶³ It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh is no help at all. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. ⁶⁴ But there are some of you who do not believe." (For Jesus knew from the beginning who those were who did not believe, and who it was who would betray him.) ⁶⁵ And he said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father."

"I Am the Bread of Life"

²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" 26 Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you are seeking me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. ²⁷ Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you. For on him God the Father has set his seal." ²⁸ Then they said to him, "What must we do, to be doing the works of God?" 29 Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." 30 So they said to him, "Then what sign do you do, that we may see and believe you? What work do you perform?

31 Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" 32 Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. 33 For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

Repentance: Pulling the Weeds


Our march through the season of Pentecost continues. As you may recall from last month, the color in our chancel for this season is green, signifying growth. Outside we see the growth of grass and trees, flowers and crops. Plant a seed in the Spring and watch it grow through the Summer. What we see is an increase, from a small seed to a large plant, from a single seed to a plant of many seeds.

Jesus teaches in the parables that the Word of God is like a seed, comparable to a tiny mustard seed growing into a large plant, or the seeds scattered by a farmer increasing thirty, sixty, even a hundredfold (Matt 13:23, 31). So the book of Acts, chronicling the growth of the Church in the early years after Jesus' ascension into heaven, speaks of the Word of God: "And the Word of God continued to increase..." (6:7). "But the Word of God increased and multiplied" (12:24). "So the Word of the Lord continued to increase and prevail mightily" (19:20).

The Word of God increases among us just as seeds planted give increase. Likewise, as the growth of a plant is inhibited by the presence of weeds, so the growth of God's Word in our lives is inhibited by a pernicious weed called "sin." Farmers and gardeners weed their fields and gardens to maximize the increase they hope to receive from the seeds they plant. So we are called to repent that the weeds of our sins may be removed from us and the Word may "increase and prevail mightily" in our midst.

Hear the call to repent, and like a diligent farmer or gardener, make it a daily habit. Uproot your sins before they get the upper hand and choke out the growth God intends for His Word in your life. Pull those weeds and lay them at the foot of the cross. In other words, "repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mk 1:15).

God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit bless your penitential meditation this month as we set our focus on the very prevalent and persistent sin of "giving false testimony." God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith as He gives increase to His Word in your life. Amen.





The Eighth Commandment You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Ouestions for Self-Reflection:

Do I gossip, listen to rumors, or take pleasure in talking about the faults or mistakes of anyone? Do I defend others against false accusations? Do I judge others without the authority to do so?

Do I speak the truth in love, trying at all times to explain everything in the best possible way? (From Lutheran Service Book, Pastoral Care Companion, CPH, 2007)

Have you committed perjury, or affirmed with an oath what you do not know to be true? Have you spoken or thought ill of anyone, repeated gossip or rumors, or damaged anyone's reputation? (From Preparation through Reflective and *Introspective Examination*, Emmanuelpress.us)


Learning to Think Biblically



DID YOU KNOW - LUTHERANS INVENTED HYMNALS?


This was a statement "boldly stated (by) the Rev. Dr. Jon Vieker, dean of the chapel at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis" He was a speaker at a weeklong symposium (May 24-27, 2022) held in the Dominican Republic. The symposium included education about and celebration of the release of a new Spanish-language hymnal.

Dr. Vieker went on to support his statement: Yes, a hymnal was assembled in Czech in 1501 while "the refinement and widespread printing of hymnals was found first among the Lutherans." He went on to say: "More importantly, the widespread use of these hymnals among Lutherans became one of the major vehicles for the spread of the Gospel throughout Germany and much of the rest of Europe. So having said all of that, I will say it again: Lutherans invented hymnals."

Another quote from Dr. Vieker: "Luther learned from his first hymn that hymns can spread the Gospel." [above information is from Lutherans Engage, Fall 2022: Fostering a Lutheran Identity in Latin America]

Indeed, we have God's Word proclaimed and our faith supported and strengthened with the hymns we sing each Sunday!

This grant will provide funds to support the outreach effort to young adults to encourage their involvement in LFL Life Teams and Life Chapters.



lowa floods strike three LCMS congregations

On June 22, heavy rainfall led to catastrophic flooding in northwestern Iowa. What residents described as a "wall of water" hit several towns near the Little Sioux River. Water completely covered the landscape. Three congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) were severely affected by the flood: Christ the King Lutheran Church in Spencer, Iowa; First English Lutheran Church in Spencer, Iowa; and Trinity Lutheran Church in Hawarden, Iowa. Both Christ the King and Trinity suffered significant damage to their church properties, and the flooding damaged the homes of dozens of families in these congregations.
